






### Boosting ROI with construction daily reporting software isn't necessarily a straight-forward process. Challenges include:


### **Instant Access to Information**


### Part Two: Implementing Daily Reporting Software for Optimal ROI

Daily reporting software improves documentation to help the company make more money, so it can continue to provide workers with employment at a stable and growing company.























### Employees view Software-based Reporting as "Extra Work"

Everyone hates doing extra work. It might be helpful to point out all of the areas where your company is doing extra work and not getting paid for it because employees aren't accurately documenting their work activities. Once employees understand the importance of reporting things right away, they'll realize that doing it with software is a lot less work.



### Use the Carrot or the Stick

Some companies are carrot organizations, and some are stick organizations - what kind of company is yours? If your team responds well to incentives, create an incentive for the project team that is most successful at adopting the new changes. Offer a free lunch or dinner for the entire team and watch your staff submit loads of awesome daily reports with pictures, receipts, and everything else needed to manage your project.

If your team doesn't get excited by incentives, that means you're a stick organization. Just tell the employees that they won't be reimbursed for expenses if they are submitted more than a day late because it disrupts the project budget and workflow when information is not received on time. After an incident or two, they'll realize it's time to adapt to the new changes.

### **Work Completed**

Work reports allow project managers to assess and manage the performance of labor crews, and to identify potential sources of delays and address them before they happen. Work records should include what materials were used, allowing project managers to improve job costing models over time, and allocate expenses appropriately to the client. Pictures of the job site can be submitted through daily reporting software, creating a body of evidence that work was completed according to specifications.
























### **Delays & Lost Hours**






### Safety/Environmental Incidents








### **Avoid Reinventing the Wheel**
